Green Cart Weekly Pick-Up Has Begun

Weekly pick up of green carts has started for the season and will continue until October 27. Please take extra care to place only accepted compostable items in your green cart before rolling it to the curb on your scheduled waste collection day.

Common items that can be placed in your green cart are:

- Vegetable and fruit waste
- Dairy products and eggs
- Meat and bones
- Baked goods
- Soiled cardboard (pizza box liners)
- Paper coffee filters, grounds and tea bags



- Cat litter and dog feces (loose or in certified compostable bags)
- Yard waste (leaves, grass clippings, weeds, branches less than three feet in length and one inch in diameter, etc).

No garbage bags, plastic bags, metal, treated wood, glass, Styrofoam, etc. Use certified compostable bags only.

- Annual Back Alley Pick Up of Compostable Yard Waste Mark your calendar! The Town's annual back alley collection of compostable yard waste begins on Tuesday, May 23. Town crews will make one pass down each back alley in Ponoka to collect yard waste (grass clippings, leaves, weeds, branches between three to five feet) in excess of what will fit into your green cart. - Waste Transfer Summer Hours The Waste Transfer Station has now switched to summer hours, which are 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Summer hours will continue until October 31.
- Grey Carts and Green Carts should be placed at the curb for pick up on May 3, 4 and 5 depending on your Zone.
- Green Carts and Recyclable Materials bundled in clear or blue transparent plastic bags should be placed at the curb for pick up on May 10, 11 and 12 - depending on what Zone you live in.
