

### **Christmas Tree Pickup Begins January 21**

The Town of Ponoka's annual collection of compostable Christmas trees begins Tuesday, January 21. The Town will make one pass down each back alley in Ponoka to pick up compostable Christmas trees that have been placed outside for collection.

Ponoka residents are asked to place their Christmas tree for pick up at their back alley no later than Monday, January 20.

Residents who do not have a back alley can place Christmas trees near the curb at the front of their property, ensuring the items are visible for pickup.

Please note that weather conditions may delay Christmas tree pick up as Town crews may have to divert their attention to snow and ice control operations.

# **Municipal Election 2025**



The next general municipal election will be held on Monday, October 20, 2025.

Ponoka residents will be able to vote for members of Town Council, which consists of one mayor and six councillors. All of these positions are open for election in 2025.

Prospective candidates can now submit their Notice of Intent to Run form with the Town of Ponoka Election Office.

You must file your Notice of Intent to Run before accepting contributions or incurring campaign expenses. Once the Election Office receives your completed form, your name will be added to the Register of Candidates on the Town of Ponoka's website at **Ponoka.ca/p/election-2025**.

• 2025 Town of Ponoka Utility Rates Take Effect January 1 - The 2025 Town of Ponoka Utility Rate Bylaw was approved by Ponoka Town Council at a recent meeting. Overall, a family using 20 cubic metres of water per month will see an estimated monthly utility rate increase of 3.8 per cent or \$5.78 for water, sewer, curbside waste collection and storm sewer fees in 2025.

The 2025 utility rates reflect inflationary cost increases based on an estimated annual Alberta Consumer Price Index for 2025. The rates also reflect ongoing direction given by the Alberta provincial government which advises that utility services be self sustaining and discourages municipalities from using property taxes or grant funding to help pay for utilities.
