The Town of Ponoka Ice Sculpture Village is open daily and free to attend.

Visitors to the Ice Sculpture Village are asked to please stay on the pathways and do not climb on the ice sculptures, with the exception of the following interactive sculptures:

- The horse-drawn carriage Visitors can carefully climb into the sleigh and sit on the ice-carved bench seat to take photos; and
- The ice throne You are welcome to carefully step up and sit on the throne to fully enjoy the majesty of this life-sized sculpture.

- Town of Ponoka Christmas Tree Pick Up The annual pick up of compostable Christmas trees will start on Monday, January 23. All trees must be placed outside for pick up by end of day on Sunday, January 22. The Town will make one pass down each back alley to collect compostable Christmas trees. If there is no back alley, compostable Christmas trees should be placed in front of the property near the curb. Please note that weather conditions can delay Christmas tree pick up, as Town crews may have to divert their attention to snow and ice control. Citizens can also participate in the Christmas tree program by taking their trees to the Waste Transfer Station to be composted free of charge.
- **Christmas Light Display on Until End of February** The tens of thousands of festive lights are still on at Lions Centennial Park which is located on Highway 2A north of Highway 53. Citizens can take in the festive lights throughout the winter months by taking a stroll or lacing up their skates and enjoying the skating trail that winds throughout the park.
